<u>April</u>

On April 10th, 2023, the NSS Environment Volunteers organised a special event at Bapudham Colony to commemorate World Health Day. The volunteers began by introducing the significance of World Health Day and distributing Snake plants, enlightening the residents about their numerous benefits. They conducted a Pepper experiment to underscore the importance of hand hygiene before meals and engaged in discussions covering physical, mental, and emotional aspects of health. The event culminated with a calming meditation session led by NSS volunteers.



On April 12th, 2023, NSS Carmel Animal Lover Volunteers organised a popcorn stall during the break, manned by Peedus Class 6th students, with the noble aim of raising funds for animal vaccination. Through their efforts, the students successfully raised a total amount of Rs 3500, contributing to the welfare of animals.



On April 18th, 2023, the NSS community service volunteers executed the "Hand in Hand" project. Students from classes 1st to 12th generously donated their used books, backpacks, and toys with the intention of helping those in need. The NSS volunteers efficiently segregated the donated books by their respective classes, and all these items were then handed over to the Government Model School in Sector 35, Chandigarh, facilitating access to educational resources for the less privileged.



On April 20th, 2023, NSS volunteers collected chapatis and pickle from students in classes 6th to 12th. The collected food items were then distributed to those in need at various locations including ,Government Hospital in Sector 16, near PGI, Sec 19 market, and Government Hospital in Sector 6, Panchkula.




power of conversations and storytelling and it turned out to be a successful event








NSS SEVEN DAY CAMP-2023-24
















